RECOGNITION

100 BEST FLEETS

For the fourth consecutive year, University Fleet Operations (UFO) received the prestigious award of being named to the 100 Best Fleets. UFO ranked 65th on the list and, once again, was the highest ranked university on the list.



ADA SOLUTIONS

The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation informed the university that any space that is not ADA compliant could no longer be signed for ADA or considered part of PTS's ADA parking inventory. Although not ADA compliant, many of these spaces are close to buildings and have come to be relied upon by the ADA community. To ensure these spaces would continue to be reserved for those with ADA needs, PTS converted them to Special Accommodation spaces, only accessible to D+ permit holders, a new permit type that is only valid with the display of ADA credentials.

NEW PARKING

PTS added several new locations to its parking inventory including the Nueces Garage (NUG), serving resident students living at the university's 2400 Nueces Apartments. The lots at 2007 Guadalupe St. and 2008 Whitis Ave., including the former Darque Tan lot and the SP+ lot, were acquired as well. PTS installed a meter to make these accessible to the public.






PARKING PORTAL ENHANCEMENTS

A couple new options were added to My Parking Profile including the "Upgrade My Permit" section, which allows permit holders to see what other permits are available, exchange their current permit for one of those options, or get a new permit of the same type if they have lost their permit. Green on the Go permits were also added to the "Cars" tab so carpool members could generate a QR code for garage access and see their balance of remaining uses.

PERMIT REIMBURSEMENTS

Permit holders were not expected to pay for parking while the university was in remote status due to COVID-19 unless they continued to park on campus. Permits purchased prior to March 13, 2020 were reimbursed, or payroll deduction was paused, depending on the payment method, for the remaining balance of the 2019-20 academic year. Reimbursed permit holders were given the chance to renew their permit for the fall, but not required to in order to maintain their location. PTS processed thousands of permit reimbursements during this time including \$1.2 million in student permit reimbursements alone.



Department Initiatives

REMOTE LEARNING

During the university's online model for the spring semester 2020, PTS used this time to train employees on a variety of topics with a robust schedule of online classes and resources including LinkedIn Learning, UTLearn, UT Leadership Talks, Center for Professional Education training, and Human Dimensions of Organizations webinars. Some of the training topics included grammar, writing, cash handling, stress management, customer service, listening skills, goal setting, career advancement, communication, business etiquette, time management, Microsoft Teams, ethics, and resilience. After training, employees completed assignments to demonstrate what they had learned. Employees also completed a host of individualized training tailored to their job duties. While remote, employees were kept engaged with one another through social opportunities such as the Pantry Challenge, Music Monday Luncheon, Virtual Brunch, Online Scavenger Hunt, Good News Coffee Hour, virtual shadowing and cross-training, daily movement challenges, and the PTS employee blog.

EMPLOYEE ENGAGEMENT

Before the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic closure, PTS hosted several in-person events for its employees for team and morale building including a Halloween costume contest, holiday gift exchange, and an off-site Bingo night.

FACILITY UPGRADES

The PTS maintenance team took on several large projects in addition to their daily duties. They converted the 27th Street Garage lights to LED, making the garage brighter and more energy efficient. They installed electrical plug covers to secure outlets throughout the garages. They restriped and signed lots at the university's Lake Austin Center and Brackenridge Field Laboratory. They also converted all parallel and sloped ADA spaces to Special Accommodation spaces for D+ permit holders.
