Sure Walk

Bike UT

Registration increases the chances that your bike can be returned to you if stolen or impounded. It is free at www.parking.utexas.edu through My Parking Profile.

Bike storage is available on racks for free, in parking garage lockers for a fee, and at the East Campus Garage storage facility for free or a fee, depending on if you're a permit holder. If you don't have a bike but need one, consider borrowing one from CapMetro Bikeshare at a low cost. Get all the latest bike news at <https://parking.utexas.edu/bike>.

Mainline

UT students get fare-free access to all of CapMetro's nearly 100 routes throughout the city. Not only does that include city buses but the MetroRail and BRT as well.

Electric Scooters

Those who utilize electric scooters must operate them according to campus rules and regulations. Scooters should not be operated on a sidewalk unless traveling to/from a bike rack. Scooters must yield to pedestrians and not exceed 15 mph. Scooters should be parked around bike racks or designated scooter parking areas, and never block pedestrian pathways or ADA access. Carpool

At UT, it only takes two to join a carpool and those that register their carpool get an array of benefits: reserved parking spaces, reduced permit fees, free garage parking, and enrollment in the Guaranteed Ride Home program, providing mass transit or taxi in the event of an emergency. PTS Pickup

PTS Pickup offers free curb-to-curb cart transportation Monday through Friday, from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Just wave down a PTS Pickup driver, let them know your destination, and you're on your way! Electric Vehicles

Electric vehicle charging stations are available on main campus in Manor Garage and San Antonio Garage, and at J.J. Pickle Research Campus in Lot 202. To use these stations, sign up for an account with ChargePoint. Members have access to any available station across the US.

Shuttles

The UT Shuttle System is one of the largest university shuttle systems in the country, with eight routes and nearly 2 million passengers annually. It provides rides for students, faculty and staff, and visitors to access UT campus Sunday through Friday.

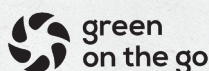
Car Sharing
